



YOGA & DIET FOR A HEALTHY HEART

Heart is the most vital organ of the body. It pumps 7500 litres of blood per day to supply the oxygen and nutrients to all the tissues and organs. It beats 1,00,000 times a day continuously. Heart gets its nourishment through the coronary artery. The blood supply to the heart muscle is restricted/ reduced due to constriction of coronary artery and deposition of fatty plaque or clots in the lumen of this artery. This ultimately results in the development of cardiovascular diseases like angina pectoris, coronary heart disease, heart failure, hypertension, stroke etc., which impose a significant morbidity and mortality. Heart disease is the **leading cause of death in India** as well as globally. In spite of greatly improved diagnostic procedures and advancement in treatment modalities, about 15 millions die of heart disease every year. It is a matter of serious concern that the relatively young (30-50 yrs old) professionals, who are at the peak of their career and productivity become victims of angina, hypertension and heart attack. The common symptoms of heart disease are shortness of breath, chest pain radiating to left arm, cold hands and feet, frequent perspiration and fatigue. The most important cause of heart disease is the stress and strain of 'modern life' characterized by hurry, worry and anxiety of fast paced life. Other causes are change in family structure leaving no cushion to deal with one's personal, professional and family problems; forcing the victim to consume the time saving high fat diet, high calorie, nutrient poor junk food supported by sedentary life style, smoking, alcohol, increased automobile use and lack of physical exercise. The scientific and spiritual discipline of yoga is an effective and time tested method for improving our health, as well as for prevention and management of diseases, especially the psychosomatic and life style diseases.

Savasana, yoga-nidra, meditation and slow rhythmic pranayama (nadi-shodhan, anulom-vilom and bhramari) breathing are very effective in calming and relaxing the mind; and promoting the psychosomatic health. Heart patients are sensitive and reactive. Regular yoga practices help to stabilize the mind and make one emotionally balanced. Yogasanas like – tadasana, trikonasana, bhujangasana, ardhmatsayendrasana and dhanurasana strengthen the lung and heart. Diet also plays an important role in the prevention and management of heart disease. Patients with heart disease should increase their intake of **Vitamin-C (amla), Vitamin-E (wheat grass and cabbage) and Vitamin-B (whole grain cereals)**.

Studies have indicated that alfa-alfa, yogurt, garlic and onion can reduce the blood cholesterol level. Apple and grapes also strengthen the heart. The use of salt, sugar, tea and coffee should be restricted. The patient should also avoid white flour products, sweets, chocolates, soft drinks, all hard fats of animal origin (butter, cream and fatty meats) and canned foods in syrup, alcohol and tobacco. The above holistic approach of yoga-meditation and diet is the best method to protect our **most precious organ-heart** from the deleterious effects of stress and strain of present day life.

IN MEMORIAM: ROKEYA SAKHAWAT HUSSAIN

Rokeya Sakhawat Hosain, a pioneer feminist writer of pre-independence India, is noted for her two feminist utopias *Sultana's Dream* and *Padamarag*. Rokeya's depiction of women's question makes her remarkable as she presents two diverse facets of feminism. Rokeya is a pioneer feminist writer of colonial Bengal much ahead of her time. She shares universal vision of patriarchy and emerges as an iconoclast who is at odds with patriarchal subordination. Rokeya's endeavours are not restricted to theory. Practically she did a lot to liberate women from marginalization and oppression. In *Sultana's Dream*, she rejects the existence of man but in *Padamarag* her maturity and farsighted vision find expression as she presents that man and woman can co-exist harmoniously. As a third world feminist, Rokeya locates indigenous cultural roots in order to counter colonial feminist discourse. Rokeya strives for the assimilation of local cultural heritage fused with new ideas of the west. She lays bare western ostentation of female liberation in the form of Helen Horace, and glorifies ancient Indian and pristine Islamic civilization for their broad outlook regarding the women: "She was interested in western feminist ideas and aspirations but skeptical and critical of the limitations and obstacles to women's true equality in the west".

Rokeya's rancour towards patriarchal subordination and oppression, as reflected in her two utopias, is the outcome of her own familial situation and experiences in life. Though born into an elite family she was deprived of any schooling due to the orthodoxy prevalent in Muslim society. Rokeya's writings have been labelled as blasphemous and considered an onslaught on Islam. Rokeya, however, grew up in a deeply religious family. The misconstruction of her texts as blasphemous and secular is due to her denouncement of religious bigotry as well as misogynistic version of Islam. Religion in Rokeya's contemporary society was manipulated by the patriarchy that deprived women of their religious rights. She is best remembered for her feminist endeavours in the field of education, by opening the first school for Muslim girls in the memory of her late husband. The school still exists in Bangladesh and commemorates her feminist spirit.

MAHATMA GANDHI

Mahatma Gandhi: Born in Oct 2, 1869, Porbandar Gujrat, died in Jan 30, 1948, Married to Kasturba Makhanji at the age of 14. In 1888 went England to study Law from University College in London, came back India in 1891 and Joined Indian firm named Dada Abdullah & Co. for the post of Natal in South Africa. Founded Indian Natal Congress in 1894. September 11, 1906 Gandhi adopted the method of Satyagrah or non-violence. In the year 1915, Mahatma Gandhi permanently shifted to India. His political was leader Gopal Krishna Gokhale. Gandhiji took the leadership of the Congress party in the year 1920. The first successful struggle was in the years 1917 and 1918 respectively with the Champaran (Bihar) and Kheda (Gujrat) agitations. In 1919 started Non-cooperation movement and civil disobedience movement in 1920

- President of INC: 1924.
- Quit India Movement: August, 1942
- Direct Action Day: August 16, 1946
- Assassinated by Nathuram Godse at a prayer meeting in Birla House, called Raj Ghat. October 2nd, 2019 marked the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi.



SUBRAMANIA BHARATHI

- The Prime Minister of India paid tribute to poet-reformer Subramania Bharathi on his 137th birth anniversary, describing him as a symbol of patriotism. C. Subramaniya Bharathi was born on 11th December 1882, in Ettayapuram village of Tirunelveli District in Tamil Nadu. He was a poet, freedom fighter and social reformer from Tamil Nadu.
- He was known as Mahakavi Bharathiyar and his songs on nationalism and freedom of India helped to rally the masses to support the Indian Independence Movement in Tamil Nadu.
- Few of his poems are: "Kannan Pattu, Nilavum Vanminum Katrum, Panchali Sabatham and Kuyil Pattu".
- He published the sensational "Sudesa Geethangal" in 1908.



GURU NANAK DEV

- Guru Nanak Dev Jayanti is observed to celebrate the birth of Guru Nanak Dev (1469-1539), who is first of the 10 Sikh Gurus and the founder of Sikhism.
- He advocated the 'Nirguna' (devotion to and worship of formless divine) form of bhakti.
- He rejected sacrifices, ritual baths, image worship, austerities and the scriptures of both Hindus and Muslims.
- He organised his followers into a community. He set up rules for congregational worship (Sangat) involving collective recitation.
- The fifth preceptor, Guru Arjan Dev, compiled Guru Nanak Dev's hymns along with those of his four successors and other religious poets like Baba Farid, Ravidas (also known as Raidas) and Kabir in the *Adi Granth Sahib*.
- These hymns, called 'Gurbani', are composed in many languages.
- In the late seventeenth century the tenth preceptor, Guru Gobind Singh, included the compositions of the ninth guru, Guru Tegh Bahadur, and this scripture was called the *Guru Granth Sahib*.
- The Prime Minister of India participated in the special event organised at Dera Baba Nanak to inaugurate the Integrated Check Post (ICP) and the Kartarpur Corridor. He also released commemorative coin celebrating 550th Birth Anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji.



BHIM RAO AMBEDKAR


- Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was born on 14 April 1891 in Mhow, Central Province (now Madhya Pradesh).
- He founded Bahishkrit Hitkarni Sabha (1923).
- He led the Mahad Satyagraha in March 1927 to challenge the regressive customs of the Hindus.
- Mahaparinirvan Diwas is observed every year on December 6 to commemorate death anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar.
- He is known as the Father of the Indian Constitution and was independent India's first law minister.
- In 1932 he signed Poona pact with Mahatma Gandhi, which abandoned the idea of separate electorates for the depressed classes (Communal Award). However, the seats reserved for the depressed classes were increased from 71 to 147 in provincial legislatures and to 18% of the total in the Central Legislature.
- In 1936, he was elected to the Bombay Legislative Assembly as a legislator (MLA).
- In 1947, Dr. Ambedkar accepted PM Nehru's invitation to become Minister of Law in the first Cabinet of independent India.
- On August 29, 1947, he was appointed Chairman of the Drafting Committee for the new Constitution.
- He resigned from the cabinet in 1951, over differences on the Hindu Code Bill.
- In 1956, he converted to Buddhism.
- He passed away on 6th December 1956.
- Chaitya Bhoomi is a memorial to B. R. Ambedkar located in Dadar, Mumbai.



SAVITRIBAI PHULE

- Savitribai Phule was born on 3 January 1831 at Naigaon in Maharashtra's Satara district.
- At the age of 9, she was married to 13-year-old Jyotirao Phule.
- Jyotirao Phule, better known as Jyotiba, was also a social reformer who worked in the field of women education. Jyotirao educated Savitribai at home after their marriage.
- Savitribai Phule died on 10 March 1897, while caring for a patient in the clinic she had opened for the treatment of those affected by the bubonic plague.
- In the 19th century, public education was limited and there were only a few missionary schools which were "open to all". In this period, Jyotiba, at the age of 21, and Savitri, 17, opened a school for women in 1848.
- It was the country's first school for women started by Indians.
- In the 1850s, the Phule couple initiated two educational trusts—the Native Female School, Pune and The Society for Promoting the Education of Mahars, Mangs and Etceteras—which came to have many schools under them.
- She published *Kavya Phule* in 1854 and *Bavan Kashi Subodh Ratnakar* in 1892. In her poem, *Go, Get Education*, she urges the oppressed communities to get an education and break free from the chains of oppression.
- In 1852, Savitribai started the Mahila Seva Mandal to raise awareness about women's rights.
- In 1890, Jyotirao passed away. Defying all social norms, she lit his funeral pyre.
